


Look at the content of all your BSc courses and compare to the admission requirements. Do you think you fulfil all the requirements?


It is the content of your courses that counts

Apply by the deadline

You must apply by 15 January

We do not accept late applications. You must submit your application in the application portal by 15 January at 23.59 (Danish time).

It is your responsibility to upload all required documents

We will send you a message in the application portal if we find something is missing from your application.

You will have one week to submit the requested documents.

If you do not upload all required documents you risk having your application rejected.

Please keep this in mind when we go through the slides about the different kinds of documents and deadlines

Completed Courses

In addition to graduation thesis, the following courses include 5 types of courses: general courses, professional basic courses, professional core courses, professional elective courses, and public elective courses. Among them, the first three categories are compulsory courses, and the latter two are optional courses. General courses aim to teach basic knowledge. Professional basic, core and elective courses are related to the major of ornamental horticulture. Public elective courses are chosen by students out of personal interest and do not have direct link with this major. Because some general courses and public elective courses are not closely related with the programme I applying for (e.g., Appreciation of movies, Introduction to Mao Zedong thoughts and Chinese Socialism), they are not listed in the table below.

Some courses include classroom-based theory courses and practice courses, and students are taught by same teacher during them, so the credits, ECTS, and duration are the sum total of both theory course and practice course in this table. In undergraduate academic record sheet, the course titles of these practice courses usually are as same as theory course titles or marked with a '(practice)' after theory course titles. Except these courses, there is another kind of experimental course. This kind of course is different from the practice course. They are usually conducted in the laboratories or companies and are listed separately in this table. Additionally, because some courses are divided into two parts and are conducted in two semesters (there are two final exams and two grades in record sheet), the credits, ECTS, and duration of these courses in this table are also the sum of the two semesters.

4. GPA calculation

We use your GPA calculation to determine if you may be considered for one of the faculty's few governmental scholarships. Additionally, some programmes use GPA as a selection criterion.


You must calculate your GPA (even if you have an official GPA from your university)

We must be able to compare many different grading systems. This is why you must calculate your GPA in percentage by using **our** UCPH specific GPA calculator.

How to calculate your GPA

You must use our GPA calculator that has a "how-to" guide included.

Once you have calculated your GPA in percentage, you must enter the result in your application and upload your GPA calculator as an excel file.

6. Proof of English language proficiency

You must document one of the following bullets to fulfill the language requirements:

Deadline 15 January

- Danish high school with minimum English B
- Danish bachelor's degree
- Nordic entrance exam with a level comparable to English B in Denmark
- An English-taught high school diploma, bachelor's degree or master's degree from:
 - USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, UK or Ireland.

An exchange semester/year will not exempt you from the requirement.

- International Baccalaureate OR European Baccalaureate
- German high school: Abiturzeugnis



Accepted language tests and results

- Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE) or Advanced (CAE) passed at level C1 or C2
- IELTS (Academic incl. Online) with a minimum overall score of 6.5



Example of IELTS




7. Transcript/diploma from an MSc programme

Have you been enrolled in another master's programme?

 If you have completed MSc courses as part of an unfinished MSc degree you must upload documentation in your application.

It will be evaluated whether you are eligible for a mandatory credit transfer. This is according to Danish law.

• If you have completed a master's programme you must upload your transcript and diploma.

You must document that you have completed your Bachelor's degree no later than 20 September



2) Get your former university to send us an e-mail

- The e-mail must be sent from an official university administration e-mail account
- The e-mail must be sent directly from your university to: msc-admissions@science.ku.dk
- The e-mail must state that:
 - you have completed your bachelor's degree at their institution or
 - it must contain a link to an online or digital service where we can verify your degree
